2007 Women's Tennis Season Review

In his fourth season as head coach of the Colby-Sawyer women's tennis team, Sean McCaffery led a young Chargers squad to The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) semifinals for the second time in the past three seasons.

Seeded third in the conference tournament, Colby-Sawyer (13-4, 8-2 TCCC), with only two seniors and five sophomores and six freshmen, defeated Nichols College in the quarterfinals, 5-1.

The Commonwealth Coast Conference

Established in 1984, The Commonwealth Coast Conference provides each student-athlete with a positive experience in their pursuit of excellence, through high academic standards, quality competition, and a meaningful student life. The conference sponsors intercollegiate competition among its members in a variety of sports and supports the NCAA Division III philosophy.

Originally a conference for just men's basketball, play began in 1984 and included seven teams; Anna Maria, Coast Guard Academy, Curry, Emerson, Hellenic, Salve Regina and Wentworth.

Roger Williams joined the conference in the spring of 1985 and Hellenic withdrew that fall, as the conference retained seven members. Also added in 1985 was a men's cross country championship.

Women's basketball and men's soccer were added as conference sports in 1986. Also in '86, Gordon joined the conference fold, becoming its eighth member.

In the fall of 1989, Regis College joined the conference and a softball championship was added. In the fall of that same year, New England College took Emerson's place in the conference.

Over the next several years, four more teams were added, including Eastern Nazarene (1992), Colby-Sawyer and Nichols (1994), and the University of New England (1999), putting the conference membership at 13.

Over the years the conference also grew in the number of championships it offered, until the 2006-07 school year when it sponsored 15 championships in 10 different sports.

In the fall of 2007, the conference added its 14th member, Western New England. In 2007 the conference also saw the addition of it's first full-time commissioner, Gregg Kaye.
