Mission Statement

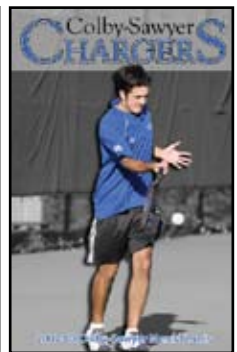

In his fourth season as head coach of the Colby-Sawyer women's tennis team, Sean McCaffery led a young Chargers squad to The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) semifinals for the second time in the past three seasons.

Seeded third in the conference tournament, Colby-Sawyer (13-4, 8-2 TCCC), with only two seniors and five sophomores and six freshmen, defeated Nichols College in the quarterfinals, 5-1. In the TCCC semi-final match, they fell to Endicott College, 6-3, but the Chargers won two of three doubles matches in that contest.

In the Colby-Sawyer Tennis Shootout over Labor Day weekend, the Chargers hosted Castleton State College, Plymouth State University, and St. Michael's College. The Chargers came away with two third-place finishes in the event for individual singles and doubles.

The Chargers opened the regular season on fire, winning their first six matches without dropping more than a single point to the opposition between Sept. 6 (8-1 at Plymouth State) and Sept. 19 (9-0 at Gordon College).

Also included in the six-game win streak was an 8-1 win over Salve Regina University on Sept. 16. The win was McCaffery's first over the Seahawks and was also the program's first victory against Salve Regina since 2002.

Colby-Sawyer then reeled off win streaks of three and four matches each, boasting seven wins in its final 11 matches.

Senior Jill Goldstein (Jamestown, R.I.) won two of her three sin-

gle matches, and both wins were in straight sets, 6-1, 6-1 and 6-1, 6-4, in the Shootout over Castleton and against Lyndon State College, respectively. Goldstein also teamed with sophomore Kate Lucas (Manchester, Mass.) to defeat a pair from Castleton in No. 1 doubles in the Shootout and played doubles with fellow senior Ashlee Willis (Derry, N.H.) twice, going 1-1. Goldstein and Willis defeated a team from Lyndon State, 8-2 on September 13th.

Willis went 2-2 on the season as a doubles player with one win coming while paired with Goldstein in their victory on Senior Day over Lyndon State. Willis and freshman Meredith Ferris (Rye, N.H.) defeated a team from St. Michael's in the Shootout and fell to a Plymouth State duo.

Sophomore Mary Francis (Steuben, Maine) was 11-5 in the No. 1 singles spot. All but two of her wins in singles were in straight sets. Francis went a combined 13-3 in doubles with sophomore Brittany Mailman (Freedom, N.H.), and freshmen Lauren DeFelice (Sandy Hook, Conn.) and Olivia Ellis (Jericho, Vt.). Francis earned First-Team All-TCCC honors in singles and was named to the second team in doubles.

Sophomore Jen LaChance (Killingworth, Conn.) was 14-4 in singles, primarily in the No. 2 position. She only lost nine sets all season, stringing together wins in 12 consecutive matches from Sept. 1, in the CSC Shootout, to Oct. 1 at Emmanuel College. She garnered TCCC Player of the Week honors the week of Sept. 10. LaChance was also named Second-Team All-TCCC in singles. In doubles, LaChance and freshman Hannah White (Stockbridge, Mass.) combined for a 12-3 mark in the top spot for the Chargers, earning another First-Team All-TCCC selection for both of them.

getting wins against Castleton, Regis College and Wentworth Institute of Technology. She paired with three different players in doubles and amassed a 10-5 record. She enjoyed the most success while teamed with DeFelice as the duo posted a 6-2 mark (3-2 in the third position).

Mailman was 12-5 (8-2 TCCC) in singles, mostly playing the fourth flight. She won her first six matches of the season, dropping one set in that span. She was 13-4 overall in doubles and had ten of those victories while partnered with Francis. The pair was named all-conference for their efforts.

DeFelice was 1-2 in singles play. She won her No. 3 match in the Shootout, 6-0, 6-0, over a player from Castleton before dropping matches against Plymouth State on Sept. 6 and Endicott on Oct. 26. DeFelice was 9-2 in doubles with three partners. She won her first seven matches of the season, four while teamed with Lucas.

Freshman Carolyn Drake (Great River, N.Y.) was 9-6 in singles, playing both in the fifth and sixth flights. She had a 6-4 mark in doubles with three partners. Drake and Lucas played together

most often, winning their first three matches of the season against Wentworth, Emmanuel and Nichols.

Ellis was 14-5, including an 8-1 record in TCCC play in singles. She won her first six matches after the Shootout, all but one was in straight sets. Drake was named TCCC Rookie of the Week on Sept. 4 after she rebounded from an opening-round loss to post 8-2 and 8-1 victories en route to winning the Flight B consolation championship in the Shootout.

Ferris was paired with Ashlee Willis in her only two matches of the season, losing both in the Shootout, 1-8 and 3-8.

White earned TCCC Rookie of the Year honors for her impressive rookie campaign, going 15-2 overall in singles and 9-1 in conference. She only dropped a total of six sets all season. In doubles, White posted an identical 9-1 mark in the conference, going 12-3 overall with LaChance. White was also named Honorable Mention All-TCCC and was a three-time TCCC Rookie of the Week selection.

Established in 1984, The Commonwealth Coast Conference provides each student-athlete with a positive experience in their pursuit of excellence, through high academic standards, quality competition, and a meaningful student life. The conference sponsors intercollegiate competition among its members in a variety of sports and supports the NCAA Division III philosophy.

Originally a conference for just men's basketball, play began in 1984 and included seven teams; Anna Maria, Coast Guard Academy, Curry, Emerson, Hellenic, Salve Regina and Wentworth.

Roger Williams joined the conference in the spring of 1985 and Hellenic withdrew that fall, as the conference retained seven members. Also added in 1985 was a men's cross country championship.

Women's basketball and men's soccer were added as conference sports in 1986. Also in '86, Gordon joined the conference fold, becoming its eighth member.

In the fall of 1989, Regis College joined the conference and a softball championship was added. In the fall of that same year, New England College took Emerson's place in the conference.

Over the next several years, four more teams were added, including Eastern Nazarene (1992), Colby-Sawyer and Nichols (1994), and the University of New England (1999), putting the conference membership at 13.

Over the years the conference also grew in the number of championships it offered, until the 2006-07 school year when it sponsored 15 championships in 10 different sports.

In the fall of 2007, the conference added its 14th member, Western New England. In 2007 the conference also saw the addition of its first full-time commissioner, Gregg Kaye.

Coach McCaffrey came to Colby-Sawyer after spending nine seasons as the head boys tennis coach at Hanover High School in Hanover, N.H. At Hanover, McCaffrey compiled a 132-20 record and led his team to a Class I State championship in the spring of 2004.

Over his coaching career, Coach McCaffrey has been honored with several awards including the 2000 USPTA New England High School Coach of the Year and a National Honorable Mention High School Coach of the Year. He was also named the 2004 New England Division Coach of the Year by the United States Professional Tennis Association and in the spring of 2005, he was selected to participate in the USA Tennis High Performance Tennis Coaching program in Park City, Utah.

Heading in to the fall of 2007, Head Coach Sean McCaffrey, in his fourth year, is once again looking to lead the Colby-Sawyer women's tennis team to another successful season. Last year Coach McCaffrey led the Chargers to a 12-5 record overall, 8-1 in conference play and a trip to the semifinal round of the The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) tournament.

Over the past three seasons under Coach McCaffrey, the women's tennis teams have posted a 30-17 record and a 20-7 record in conference play.

McCaffrey is also in his third season as the men's tennis coach at Colby-Sawyer. In his two seasons as head coach he has led the Chargers to a 14-2 TCCC regular season record and two conference Championship match appearances.
