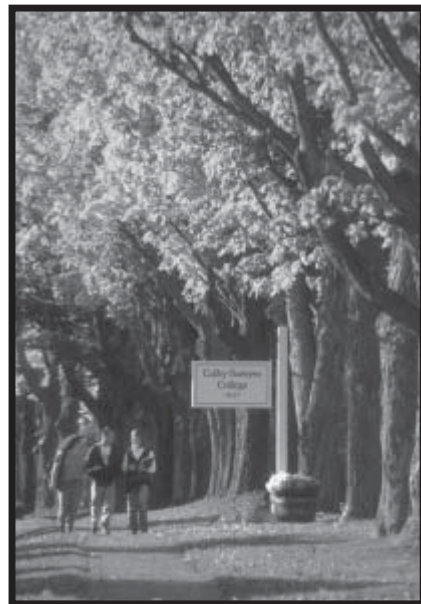

Colby-Sawyer College is located in a spectacularly beautiful area of New Hampshire, nestled in the heart of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee region. The college is 90 minutes north of Boston, Mass., one hour south of the White Mountains of New Hampshire, and three and a half hours south of Montreal, Quebec. The campus has 29 buildings situated on 200 acres. Colby-Sawyer College was home to 954 undergraduate students in 2007, representing 25 states and 11 foreign countries. The student population is comprised of 65% female and 35% male.

The college was founded in 1837, and is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE), the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), the New Hampshire Board of Nursing and the State of New Hampshire Board of Education.

Jim Broughton has served as head coach of the Colby-Sawyer baseball program for each of the 14 seasons of the team's existence, leading the Chargers to 205 all-time wins.

Last season, Coach Broughton reached the 200 win plateau on April 17, when his squad beat in-state rival Plymouth State, 7-5.

Under his direction, the Chargers captured The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) titles in 1998 and 1999 and were the runners-up in 2000. He was TCCC Coach of the Year in both of the championship years and took the 1999 squad to the ECAC Division III New England Tournament.

Coach Broughton came to New London following two seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of Southern Maine. He was a four-year starter for the Huskies and an All-American in both 1991 and 1992. His teams made three trips to the NCAA Division III College World Series, winning the national championship in 1991.

He graduated from Southern Maine in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts in History, while minoring in Elementary Education.

In the fall of 2003, Coach Broughton was inducted into the University of Southern Maine's Hall of Fame for his efforts on the baseball field. He still ranks in the top 15 in several offensive categories including games played, at bats, runs scored, hits, doubles, triples, runs batted in, total bases, walks and stolen bases.

Coach Broughton and his wife, Andrea, live in Grantham, N.H. with their two children, Emily and Caleb.

The Colby-Sawyer baseball team is coming off one of their strongest offensive seasons in recent memory and look to continue that trend of scoring runs in the 2009 season. The Chargers, who were picked to finish seventh in the pre-season coaches poll, look to bounce back after a 14-23 season last year. With the leadership of their tri-captains and the team's crop of young talent, Colby-Sawyer will not only look to make the TCCC Tournament for the twelfth straight time, but to advance deep in the playoffs with the hopes of winning the program's third championship.

When looking ahead to the 2009 season, Coach Broughton states, "We are a very young team and we will look for leadership from the handful of veterans we have back. Our strength is at the plate, in the middle of the order, as well as our defense in the infield."

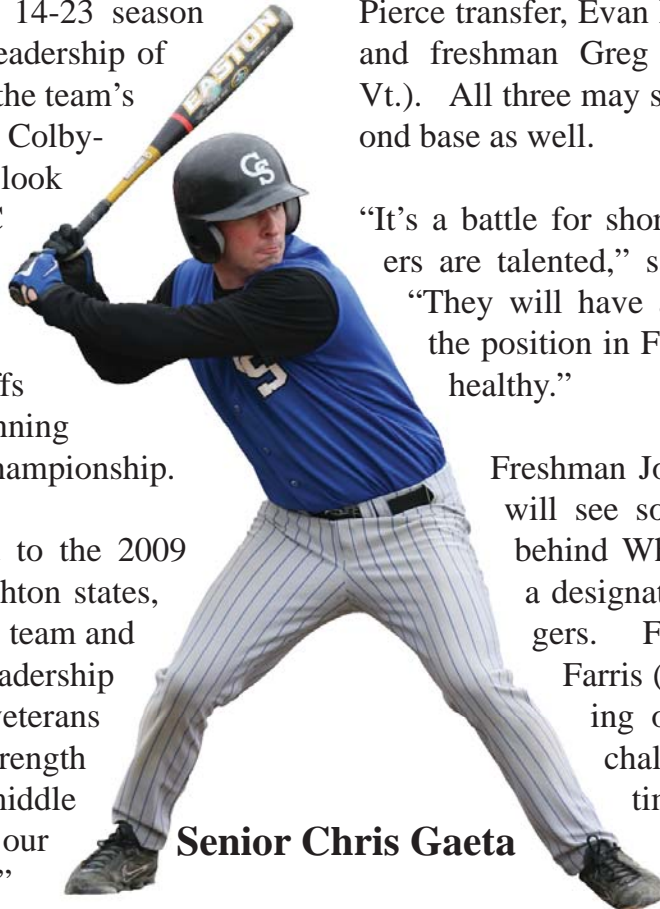
The Chargers' bats will be led by their tri-captains, Tom White (Lisbon, N.H.), Chris Gaeta (Lynn, Mass.), and Chris Hartery (Billerica, Mass.), all who are coming off career seasons last year. The trio combined to slug 17 homeruns and knock in 91 RBIs on their way to being recognized as All-Conference players. Along with their offensive play, the three make up one of the top infields in the conference. Seniors White and Gaeta will bolster down the right side of the infield as the starting first and second baseman, respectively. Hartery, only a junior, has grown into one of the best fielding third baseman in the league. Off the field, these three have the leadership ability to guide and help develop the underclassman into one of the best

classes in the program's history.

Filling out the infield is the shortstop position, where junior Jarrett Lowe (Sudbury, Mass.) started 36 games last year. This season, Lowe is accompanied by Franklin Pierce transfer, Evan Leary (Concord, N.H.) and freshman Greg Mehuron (Waitsfield, Vt.). All three may see playing time at second base as well.

"It's a battle for shortstop. All three players are talented," said Coach Broughton. "They will have an opportunity to win the position in Florida. Competition is healthy."

Freshman Joe Guidi (Derry, N.H.) will see some time at first base behind White and some time as a designated hitter for the Chargers. Fellow freshman, Ryan Farris (Nashua, N.H.) is coming off an injury and will challenge for some playing time in the outfield and at first base once he is healthy.

A group of sophomore catchers will lead Colby-Sawyer from behind the plate. Shane Hoagboon (Mayfield, N.Y.) started 20 games last year at the position and blossomed into a solid backstop and battery mate for pitchers. Brandon McFadden (Dummerston, Vt.), who had his season cut short with a hamstring injury, will look to split time with Hoagboon. Kevin Emerson (Hinesburg, Vt.) has improved his receiving and blocking skills and looks to earn some time behind the plate as well. All three players also may see playing time in the outfield.

The outfield may be the biggest question mark for Coach Broughton this season, as he lost all three starters from last year's team to

graduation. Sophomore Matt Corvo (Stratton Mountain, Vt.) has the most experience in the outfield, as he saw time at all three spots last year. University of Rhode Island transfer Justin Martin (Lebanon, N.H.) will look to see time in one of the corner positions, despite not having previous experience. Martin, who also is a solid infielder with a big stick at the plate, should not have much difficulty adjusting to a new position, due to his natural baseball ability.

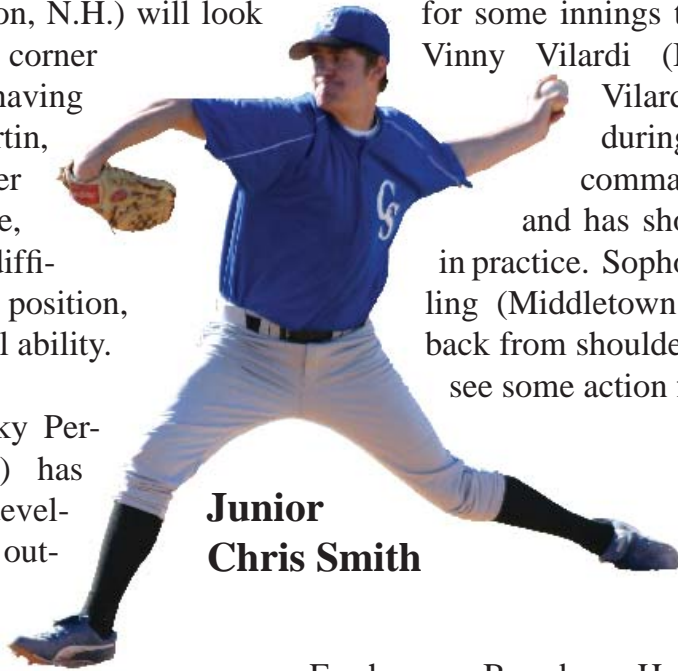
Southpaw freshman Ricky Perzentz (Westport, Mass.) has been working hard on developing his skills in the outfield and will battle for some time as a corner outfielder. Perzentz will also see valuable time on the mound as both a starter and reliever. Freshman Ryan Lawless (Charlemont, Mass.) will see time in centerfield and on the mound as well. Lawless is a hard thrower who will be an important asset out of the bullpen.

Other members of the squad who are battling for playing time in the outfield are sophomore Mike Bertuccio (Millstone Township, N.J.), and freshman Ryan Gillan (Alton, Mass.) and Matt Rosa (Manchester, N.H.).

“Our pitching staff is young and will need to step up and throw strikes on a consistent basis,” says Coach Broughton.

Southpaw junior Chris Smith (Lisbon, N.H.) will step into the roll of the team’s ace and will look to build off of last season. Bertuccio’s main role will be that of shutting down opposing offensives on the mound. With the loss of several key pitchers last year, Coach Broughton looks for Bertuccio and Smith to take charge as the team’s top pitchers.

Junior Carter Malpass (Plymouth, Mass.), who posted a 3-2 record in 2008, will once again get the ball primarily as a starter this year. Another southpaw that will look for some innings this year is senior Vinny Vilardi (Boxford, Mass.). Vilardi worked hard during the winter on the command of his pitches and has shown improvement in practice. Sophomore Mike Schilling (Middletown, R.I.) is coming back from shoulder surgery and will see some action from the bullpen.

Freshman Brendan Harding (Medford, Mass.), Greg Doucette (Ipswich, Mass), Gillan, and Rosa will all play vital roles to the Chargers pitching staff as freshman. Gillan will mainly be used as a starter, with Rosa and Harding making some starts as well. Doucette will serve as one of the team’s top relievers.

In his junior season, Gaeta had a career year. He established new career highs in batting average (.363.), which led the team, home runs (5) and RBIs (24). Starting all 37 games marked the 3rd most games a player has started in a single-season. Gaeta stole nine bases in 10 attempts and played a superb second base for the Chargers. In one of his most memorable games, Gaeta hit two home runs against Western New England on April 20, including a walk-off two-run homerun in the bottom of the seventh inning, to give the Chargers a 13-12 win. For his performance he was named the TCCC Player of the Week and was later named to the All-TCCC First Team.

Vilardi made eight appearances during his junior season including three starts. He threw 19.1 innings with nine strikeouts on the year. Vilardi made six appearances out of the bullpen in his sophomore year, pitching six innings with five strikeouts, while holding opponents to a .250 batting average. As a freshman, he threw in five games out of the bullpen. Vilardi pitched 10 innings overall and earned five strikeouts.

Tom hit .353 and led the team in homeruns (7) and RBIs (35), in his junior season, which were both career-highs. White's .667 slugging percentage was ranked second in the TCCC. For his efforts, White was named to the All-TCCC Second Team. White started all 35 games as a freshman, collecting a team-high 118 at-bats and 47 hits. White's 19 steals is a single-season record and his 15 doubles are tied for the most in a season. On the mound, White posted a 2.45 ERA and earned four saves, which is another record. White was named the TCCC Rookie of the Year and was selected to the All-TCCC First Team.



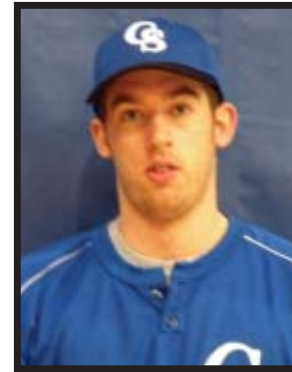

In his 14th season at the helm of the Colby-Sawyer baseball team, Head Coach Jim Broughton's Chargers finished the regular season 14-23, including a 10-12 record in The Commonwealth Coast Conference. Coach Broughton reached the 200 win plateau on April 17, when his squad beat in-state rival, Plymouth State, 7-5.

Offense. That was the theme for head coach Jim Broughton's 2008 Colby-Sawyer baseball team.

While offensive production was up (the team batted .300, their highest batting average since 2003 and hit 27 home runs, the most since 2000), the Chargers struggled out of the gate and could not string together more than three wins in a row, as injuries and a team ERA of 6.67 led to a 14-23 overall record for the Chargers.

The Chargers finished the season 10-12 in The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC), good for their 13th straight appearance in the conference tournament, as they were the No. 7 seed. In the tournament's opening round, the Chargers jumped out to an early 6-0 lead but could not hold on, as the Colonels of Curry College knotted the score in the bottom of the eighth at eight runs. Four hours and 40 minutes after the contest started, with darkness approaching, the Colonels loaded the bases in the bottom of the 15th inning and a single to left field drove in the game-winning run, handing the Chargers a 9-8 loss.

In the tournament's second round, the Chargers traveled to Rhode Island to face the Seahawks of Salve Regina University. Again the Chargers jumped out to an early 2-0 lead but were unable to hold on, closing out the season with a 9-6 loss to the Seahawks.

Four Chargers earned all-conference accolades for the Chargers in 2008. Senior Kris Ramsay (Gardiner, Maine) earned Second Team honors, juniors Tom White (Lisbon, N.H.) and Chris Gaeta (Lynn, Mass.) earned Second and First Team honors, respectively. Sophomore Chris Hartery (Billerica, Mass.) also was named to the Second Team.

Besides Ramsay, five other seniors played their final season at Colby-Sawyer, including Lee Chubet (Arlington, Vt.), John O'Neil (Burrillville, R.I.),

Justin Sakovitz (Stoneham, Mass.), Andrew Wadleigh (Sharon, Mass.) and D.J. Woodman (Farmington, N.H.).

Chubet finished third on the team in batting average, hitting .340 on the season. He tallied seven doubles, two triples, two home runs and finished fifth with 20 RBI. Chubet's six stolen bases tied him for second on the team.

O'Neil played in 19 of the Chargers 37 games on the season and was hampered by an injury. He hit .317 in 41 at bats and tallied two doubles and an RBI. Sakovitz finished the season with a 1-4 record on the hill as the left-hander appeared in seven games, starting six. He posted a 9.90 ERA in 30.0 innings, allowing 41 runs, 33 earned, and struck out 13 of the 130 batters he faced. Wadleigh batted .222 on the season, appearing in 28 games. He registered 20 hits, eight of them doubles and one home run en route to driving in 13 runs. Woodman finished with a .256 average in 86 plate appearances, registering 22 hits, including five doubles. He slugged .337, drawing 10 walks and two hit-by-pitches.

White garnered his second All-TCCC selection as he was a first team pick and TCCC Rookie of the Year in '06. His seven home runs were a team-high and were tied for second in TCCC while his 31 runs, .667 slugging percentage, nine doubles, 15 walks and 35 RBI also led the team. White hit .353, good for second, and his .452 on base percentage was also second best. White's 68 total bases were third on the team and he had only four errors in over 240 chances while leading the team with a .983 fielding percentage at first base. In 2008, White became the school's all-time doubles leader with 31 in his career. He also is in the top 10 in home runs (7), runs (74) and stolen bases (25).

Gaeta earned his first All-TCCC award for the Chargers as he led the team in hitting with a .363 average. He also had a team-high 135 at bats, 49 hits and nine stolen bases. Gaeta was second on the team with five home runs, 71 total bases, 14 walks and finished third with 24 runs batted in and fourth with seven doubles, slugging .526. He started and played in all 37 games for the Chargers and finished the regular season ranked 15th in the TCCC for batting average.

Hartery also earned his first all-conference award as he started all 37 games for the royal blue and white. Hartery led the team with nine doubles and finished the season second on the team with 131 at bats, 43 hits, 32 RBI, five home runs and three triples. He was third on the team in runs with 28, and his .557 slugging percentage was also good for second. He also had three home runs and was named TCCC Player of the Week and ECAC Player of the Week in the last week of the regular season.

Chris Baker (Essex Junction, Vt.), Ben Sweeney (Narragansett, R.I.) and Vinny Vilardi (Boxford, Mass.) rounded out the junior class for the Chargers. Baker finished the season with a 4-5 record on the mound for the Chargers, posting a 3.59 ERA in 10 appearances. He tallied 16 strikeouts in 47.2 innings of work as the Chargers workhorse on the mound. His 10 career wins also place him sixth all-time in the Colby-Sawyer record book. Sweeney finished with a .222 batting average in 18 plate appearances, registering four hits. Vilardi finished the season with an 0-2 record in eight appearances on the hill. He tallied nine strikeouts in 19.1 innings of work.

Three sophomores joined Hartery on the 2008 roster, as Jarrett Lowe (Sudbury, Mass.), Carter Malpass (Plymouth, Mass.) and Chris Smith (Lisbon, N.H.) all saw significant time for the Chargers.

Lowe started 36 of 37 games for the Chargers in 2008 at shortstop. He hit .267 in 120 at bats, registering 32 hits including six doubles and one home run. He also was second on the team in assists with 88. Malpass appeared in eight games for the Chargers on the mound, compiling a 3-2 record with a 5.33 ERA. He pitched 27.0 innings, striking out 17 and allowed 16 earned runs. Smith made 10 appearances on the mound for the Chargers, including seven starts. He went 2-4 with an 8.70 ERA in 40.1 innings of work. He struck out 24 on the year.

Eight newcomers joined the Colby-Sawyer baseball team in 2008, including Mike Bertuccio (Millstone Township, N.J.), Matt Corvo (Stratton Mountain, Vt.), Kevin Corkum (Broad Brook, Conn.), Kevin Emerson (Hinesburg, Vt.), Michael Guanci (Bedford, Mass.), Shane Hoagboon (Mayfield, N.Y.), Brandon McFadden (Dummerstan, Vt.) and Mike Schilling (Middletown, R.I.).

Bertuccio finished the season with nine appearances on the hill for the Chargers, posting a 1-3 record and a 5.04 ERA in 30.1 innings of work. He struck out 17 and opponents hit .286 off the right hander. Corvo finished with a batting average of .333 and led the team with a .471 on-base percentage. He played in 23 games, knocked in 12 runs and tied for the team lead with 15 walks.

Corkum appeared in seven games and scored five runs, primarily as a pinch-runner. Emerson appeared in eight games, starting two and registered four hits, including one double. Guanci appeared in 12 games on the hill for the Chargers and was used mostly in a middle relief role. He posted a 1.17 ERA in 15.1 innings of work, striking out 10. Hoagboon appeared in 25 games for the Chargers, serving as the team's primary catcher. He started 20 games and tallied 13 hits and 13 RBI in 67 at bats.

McFadden appeared in 14 games and earned the start in nine. He tallied four RBI on five hits, one of them a double. Schilling appeared in two games on the mound for the Chargers in Florida before going down with a season-ending shoulder injury.

Established in 1984, The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) provides each student-athlete with a positive experience in their pursuit of excellence, through high academic standards, quality competition, and a meaningful student life. The conference sponsors intercollegiate competition among its members in a variety of sports and supports the NCAA Division III philosophy.

Originally a conference solely for men's basketball, the league included seven teams: Anna Maria, Coast Guard Academy, Curry, Emerson, Hellenic, Salve Regina and Wentworth.

Roger Williams joined the conference in the spring of 1985 and Hellenic withdrew that fall, as the league remained at seven members. Also added in 1985 was a men's cross country championship.

Women's basketball and men's soccer were added in 1986, as Gordon College also joined the conference fold, becoming the conference's eighth member.

In 1989, Regis College began play in the conference and a softball championship was added. New England College took Emerson's place in the conference that fall.

Over the next 10 years, four more schools entered the conference, including: Eastern Nazarene (1992), Colby-Sawyer and Nichols (1994), and the University of New England (1999), putting the conference membership at 13.

TCCC has continued to grow in the number of championships offered. The conference will sponsor 14 championships in nine different sports in the 2008-09 season, and also offers competition in three invitational sports (golf, swimming & diving and track & field).

In the fall of 2007, the conference added its 14th member, Western New England College and Gregg Kaye also became the conference's first full-time commissioner.

Colby-Sawyer College Athletic Facilities

The Dan and Kathleen Hogan Sports Center is the heart of indoor athletics and fitness on campus. The 63,000-square-foot facility features a competition-size swimming pool (Knight Natatorium), field house with basketball and volleyball courts, an aerobics room, and racquetball, squash, walleyball and handball courts.



There is also a fully equipped fitness center for team use, for individual athletes and for students' personal fitness. Mercer Hall, which recently underwent a full renovation, houses the Ray Indoor Climbing Wall, as well as a human performance laboratory that provides computerized health and fitness assessments.



Hiddenbrook Farm, a private facility located just 13 miles from Colby-Sawyer, offers box stalls, a private tack room, a 100' x 200' indoor arena, an outdoor ring, acres of turnout and miles of trails.



Dedicated in October of 1999, the Kelsey Athletic Fields are some of New England's finest. Featuring a 120 x 80 yard soccer field, a multi-purpose field and a baseball field, the surfaces and views are unparalleled. The soccer field features newly added bleachers with seating for 300 spectators to sit and cheer on the Chargers.

Also included in the outdoor athletic facilities are the Kelsey Tennis Courts, recently refinished in U.S. Open blue, and Mercer Field, another home to Colby-Sawyer's soccer and lacrosse programs.
